
When printing the templates, ensure that paper size is set to A4, and scale to 100%



The template will print each of the four sections on separate sheets.

Cut these and stick together to get the complete pattern. You can either use this or copy onto paper to make your block.

I would suggest that with this one it might be easier to redraw the 4 unit foundations on separate papers.


This month there are no instructions.

There is no $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance on the pattern.


The difference with *Cracked Log* is that you have to make 4 small units and join together as shown.




Remember to ADD $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance.
