

Roman Stripes

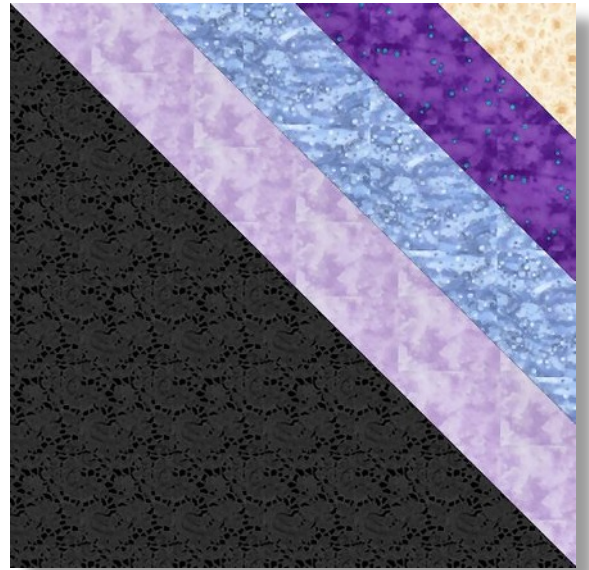

The Roman Stripe pattern is found in Amish quilts, in which the stripes are usually plain, bright colours and the triangle is black or navy blue.

The stripes are joined so that the stripes are always facing in the same direction and the effect is of patterned and plain triangles facing each other.

Quilting in straight lines in the same direction as the seams in the triangles keeps the simplicity of the design.

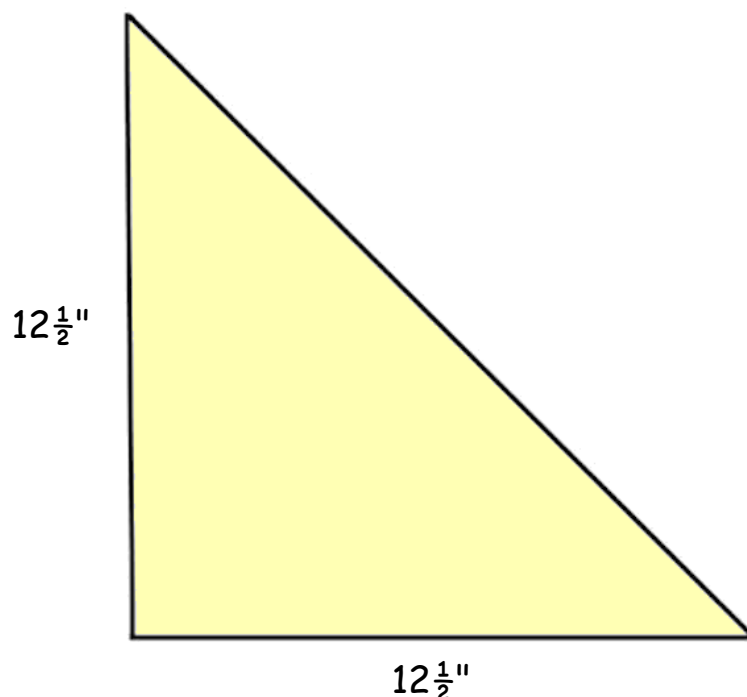


Cutting Instructions

1. Cut an 19 inch by $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip in each of Fabrics 1,2,3 and 4.
2. Cut a $12\frac{1}{2}$ by $12\frac{1}{2}$ inch triangle as shown in the diagram below.

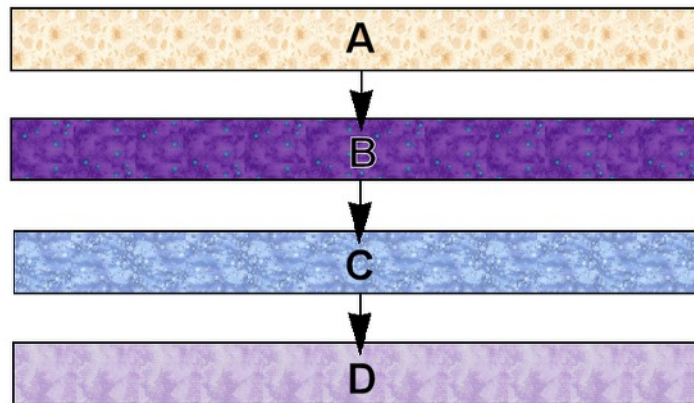
Fabrics

- Fabric 1. Cream
- Fabric 2. Purple
- Fabric 3 Light blue
- Fabric 4 Lilac
- Fabric 5. Black

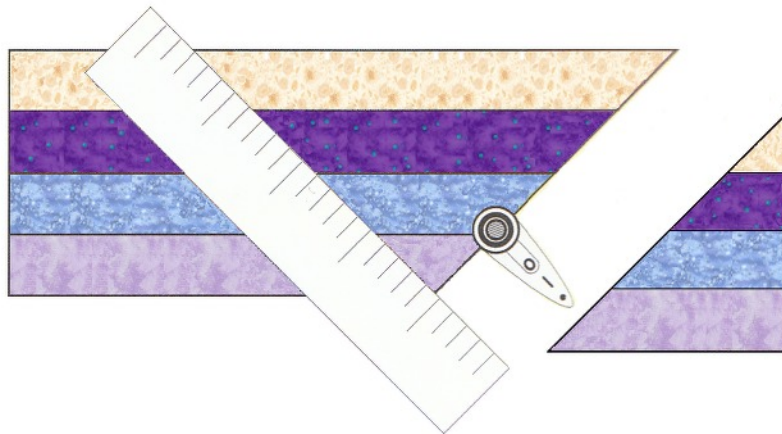


Assembly Instructions

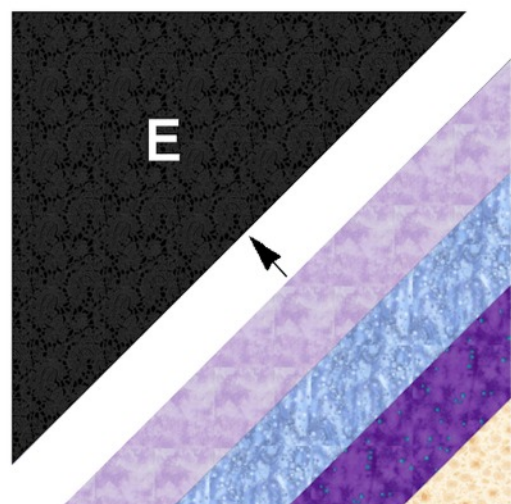
1. Take the four 18 by $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips and join together as shown.



2. Lay the pieced strips on a cutting mat and trim off one end at a 45 degree angle. Then line up the ruler to cut a right-angled triangle which has its bottom strip along the long straight edge top strip at its apex.



3. Join the pieced triangle to the plain triangle by stitching along the long edges.



You should now have a $12\frac{1}{2}$ inch square.
